A staple for any yard or garden, boxwood is a versatile plant that can be used in several different ways. Dwarf varieties can add a natural edge to garden spaces, while taller or upright varieties can transform any path or walkway into an elegant area of the home landscape with minimal upkeep.

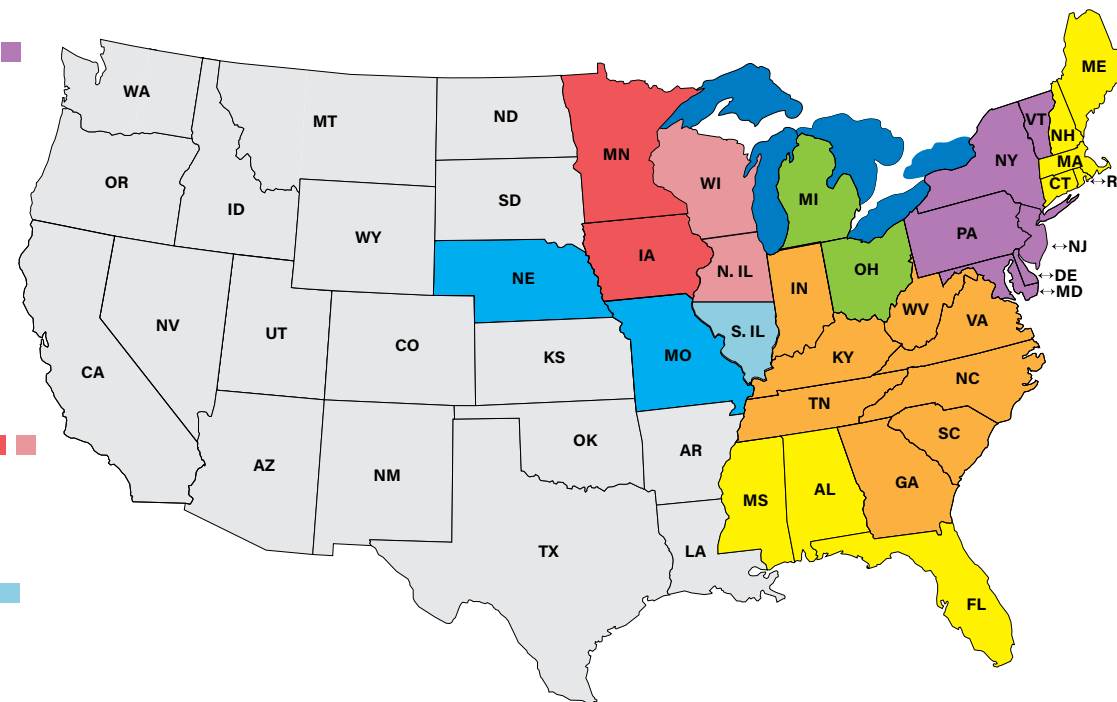

Rosea Plena Almond

Prunus glandulosa 'Rosea Plena'

Zones 4-8
3-5' tall x 3-4' wide

(Medium growth rate)

Showy, pink, double blooms cover this dwarf tree perfect for hedges or mass plantings.

- Deciduous tree blooms in early spring.
- Sometimes produces dark red fruit.
- Ideal for planting in a large container.
- Tolerates some drought conditions, once established.
- Well-drained soil is essential for best results.

Bald Cypress
Taxodium distichum



Zones 4-9
50-70' tall x 20-45' wide

(Medium growth rate)

Picturesque large, deciduous conifer that has an upright pyramidal form when young, and becomes more rounded as the tree ages.

- Adapts very well to wet soil and even clay. Prefers acidic soil, although tolerant to nearly all soil types.
- Long lived and requires little to no maintenance. Needled foliage is easy to clean up in the fall.
- Attractive all year long.

Heritage River Birch
Betula nigra 'Cully'



Zones 4-9
4-5' tall x 5' wide

(Fast growth rate)

Rivals Paper Birch for beautiful bark, but shows greater resistance to birch borer.

- Famed for its colorful, exfoliating bark; shades of light brown, purple and orange.
- Fast-growing tree provides shade and style in no time; bright yellow fall foliage.
- Tolerates moist soil; grows well in both wet and dry areas.
- Withstands strong winds and ice.

Golden Devine Barberry
Berberis thunbergia 'Golden Devine'



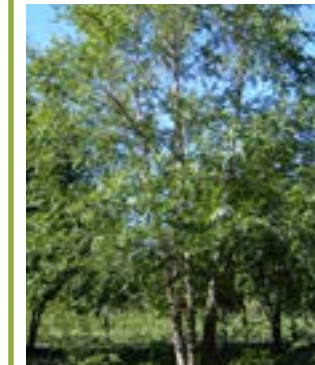
Zones 4-9
24" tall x 24" wide

(Slow growth rate)

Low-growing shrub with creamy yellow new foliage edged in pink; ages to bright yellow.

- Tiny spines and a hardy habit make this a go-to garden barberry.
- Ideal for sunny borders, as an accent plant, or as low edging.
- Neat, mounded form.
- Slow grower maintains its shape with little to no pruning.

Northern Tribute River Birch
Betula nigra 'Dickinson'



Zones 3-9
30-40' tall x 20-30' wide

(Fast growth rate)

Iconic ivory-white, exfoliating bark fits in both modern and traditional settings.

- Grows quickly and easily.
- Highly adaptable to dry and alkaline soils.
- Tolerates deer, and clay and wet soils.
- Withstands adverse winter weather down to zone 3.
- Resistant to Bronze Birch Borer damage.
- Fall foliage is a classic yellow color.

Peppermint Smoothie Althea
Hibiscus syriacus 'DS04PS' PP26551

Zones 5-8
8' tall x 4-6' wide

(Fast growth rate) once established

Double, bicolor red and pink blooms provide refreshing color from mid to late summer.

- Medium-sized shrub is ideal for borders, as a focal point or planted in groups.
- Highly adaptable to many soil types and very versatile.
- Gives the look of a tropical plant, but more reliable in most climates.
- Stands up to harsh winter weather.



Strawberry Smoothie Althea
Hibiscus syriacus 'DS02SS'

Zones 5-8
8' tall x 4-6' wide

(Fast growth rate) once established

Add color and texture to late-season landscapes when the rest of the garden is fading.

- Bears large, double, pink blooms from midsummer to fall.
- Does not produce invasive seed pods.
- A dependable perennial shrub; returns yearly.
- Stands up to harsh winter weather.



Rose Glow Barberry
Berberis thunbergii f. atropurpurea 'Rose Glow'

Zones 4-8
5' tall x 3-4' wide

(Medium growth rate)

Mid-sized shrub works well as a hedge or focal point. An award-winning variety.

- Highly ornamental with rose-red foliage splashed with pink and white.
- Bright red berries in fall attract birds to the landscape; provides winter interest.
- Easy to grow with some pest resistance.
- Versatile; plant in borders, feature beds, or as a screen or specimen shrub.



Autumn Revolution Bittersweet
Celastrus scandens 'Bailumn' PP19811

Zones 2-8
15-25' tall x 3-6' wide

(Fast growth rate)

Ornamental tree with extra-large berries that dry with color intact, make great DIY décor.

- No need for both male and female cultivars in order to produce berries.
- No pollinator necessary for flowers.
- Provides winter interest, shelter for wintering birds.
- Non-invasive cultivar.
- Drought tolerant; attracts pollinators.



Raspberry Smoothie Althea
Hibiscus syriacus 'DS03RS' PP27196

Zones 5-8
8' tall x 4-6' wide

(Fast growth rate) once established

Mid-sized shrub offers fresh color and double blooms lasting from mid to late summer.

- Deep berry-pink blooms contrast nicely with the bright green foliage.
- A dependable shrub for cold climates; stands up to adverse winter conditions.
- Grows in a natural vase shape; provides architectural interest in the landscape.
- Highly adaptable to many soil types.



Autumn Brilliance Amelanchier
Amelanchier grandifolia 'Autumn Brilliance'

Zones 4-9
15-25' tall x 15-25' wide

(Medium growth rate)

Provides year-round interest. Plant as a focal point tree or as an accent shrub.

- Fragrant, white flowers throughout spring.
- Bears red-purple berries in summer; taste somewhat like sweet blueberries.
- Fall foliage is brilliant orange and red.
- Winter bark is silvery and smooth; highly ornamental.
- Attracts birds to the landscape.



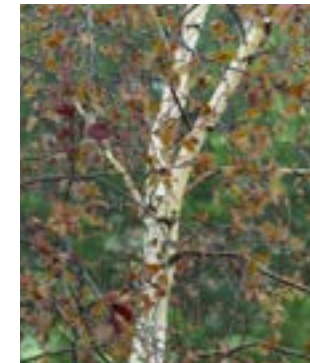
Jacquemonti Birch
Betula utilis var. jacquemontii

Zones 4-7
30-50' tall x 20-35' wide

(Fast growth rate) once established

Considered to have the brightest white bark of any of the Birches, and provides ornamental interest throughout all four seasons.

- Upright pyramidal tree form.
- Golden-yellow fall foliage is best with at least 6 hours of sun.
- Fast grower that makes a fine ornamental or shade tree.
- Ornamental catkins hang from the tree in spring.



Black Gum
Nyssa sylvatica

Zones 4-9
30-50' tall x 20-30' wide

(Medium growth rate)

Eastern U.S. native boasts brilliant fall foliage in five hues—often all colors on one branch.

- Named one of the ten best trees for fall foliage by The Arbor Day Society.
- Glossy, dark green summer foliage.
- Fall foliage shows red, scarlet, orange, yellow and purple.
- Important food source for songbirds.





Graham Blandy Boxwood

Buxus sempervirens
'Graham Blandy'

Zones 6-9
10' tall x 4' wide

   (Slow growth rate)




Narrow, columnar shape fits in perfectly with today's smaller landscapes.

- Makes a dramatic display in single plantings and when grouped in a hedgerow.
- Attractive evergreen foliage pops in winter landscapes.
- Plant along a fence line or property line to create separation and ensure privacy.
- For best form, protect from heavy snow.

Green Mountain Boxwood

Buxus, x 'Green Mountain'



   (Slow growth rate)




Slow-growing, low hedge is ideal for defining garden spaces. A neat, carefree shrub.

- Requires minimal shearing to maintain a tidy appearance.
- Tolerates heat well—great for planting in the deep south.
- Deer resistant.
- Evergreen shrub with dark green foliage.
- Compact, conical growth habit.

Green Velvet Boxwood

Buxus, x 'Green Velvet'



   (Slow growth rate)




This compact evergreen shrub adds texture and deep green color to winter landscapes.

- Versatile—great for foundation plantings, hedges and accent plants.
- Withstands hard pruning, but requires little to maintain its shape.
- Prefers slightly acidic to slightly alkaline soils.
- Deer and rabbit resistant.

Mont Bruno Boxwood

Buxus sempervirens 'Mont Bruno'



   (Slow growth rate)




Extra-hardy and robust; excellent for Northern regions.

- Tidy globe shape adds charm to borders, mixed beds and walkways.
- Low habit; fits in nearly any space.
- Tiny, dark evergreen leaves provide color and texture to gardens.
- Slow grower, maintains its shape without heavy pruning.

Winter Gem Boxwood

Buxus microphylla var. japonica 'Winter Gem'



   (Slow growth rate)

Slow-growing evergreen shrub makes a great choice for formal gardens or back borders.



- One of the hardiest small-leaved boxwood varieties.
- Foliage is rich green, but can show some bronzing in colder climates.
- One of the earliest to return to full green in the spring.
- Provides year-round interest.

Compactus Dwarf Burning Bush

Euonymus alatus 'Compactus'



Zones 4-9
4-6' tall x 4-6' wide

  (Slow growth rate)

Popular deciduous bush is carefree and famous for breathtaking red fall foliage.




- Foliage is rich emerald green in spring and a lighter green in summer.
- Corky bark and winged twigs provide winter interest.
- Rarely needs trimming to maintain its shape.
- Plant in full sun for best color display.

Little Moses Burning Bush

Euonymus alatus 'Odom' PP13168



Zones 4-8
24-36" tall x 24-36" wide

   (Slow growth rate)

Popular dwarf variety adds fiery red fall color to small sites.

- Compact and slow growing; ideal for borders, as an accent, screen or low hedge.
- Spring and summer foliage is an attractive mid green; turns bright red in fall.
- Light pruning may be required to keep at 36" tall.
- Tolerates clay soil, black walnut juglone.
- Shows good pest and disease resistance.

Pink Cascade Cherry

Prunus 'NCPH' PP27579



Zones 5-8
12' tall x 12' wide

   (Medium growth rate)

The ultimate weeping cherry—elegant form meets small footprint.





- Amazing form—graceful, sweeping boughs are eye catching even from a distance.
- Tree is covered in delicate, pink blooms in spring.
- Can be draped over a support for extra flair in the landscape.
- Top choice ornamental for small spaces.

Snow Fountain Weeping Cherry

Prunus serrulata x subhirtella 'Snoforzam'



Zones 6-8
12-15' tall x 6-8' wide

    (Slow to medium growth rate)

Graceful cascading branches and white spring flowers make it a great focal point.



- Hardy variety, though winter protection is advised.
- Great for coastal areas—tolerates sandy soil in well-drained sites.
- Attracts pollinators of all sorts to the landscape.
- Cannot ship to CA, ID, WA.

Romeo™ Bush Cherry

Prunus fruticosa x Prunus cerasus, x 'Romeo'



Zones 2-7
6-8' tall x 6-8' wide

  (Medium growth rate)

Dwarf tree yields up to 25 lbs of fruit that's sweet enough for fresh eating, tart enough for pies.



- Shorter stature makes it easy to prune, net and harvest.
- Fruit has a complex sweet-tart flavor and high flesh-to-pit ratio.
- Extremely cold hardy.
- Makes a great flowering landscape tree.
- Cannot ship to CO, OR, WA.

Wowza!® Bush Cherry

Prunus fruticosa x Prunus cerasus 'Big Red' PP32782



Zones 2-7
5-8' tall x 5-7' wide

  (Medium growth rate)

Naturally dwarfed tree makes harvesting fruit a snap. Makes a great landscape tree.

- Tart cherries with vivid red color.
- Large fruits with high flesh-to-pit ratio.
- Yields up to 20 lbs of fruit.
- Withstands harsh winter weather, hardy to -40 degrees F.
- Self-pollinating variety.
- Cannot ship to CA, CO, ID, OR, WA.



Bonfire Patio Peach

Prunus persica 'Bonfire'

Zones 5-8
5-7' tall x 12-18' wide

(Medium growth rate)

This peach tree is grown primarily for its outstanding ornamental qualities such as the large, pink flowers that cover the branches in the spring. They are quickly replaced by beautiful, striking burgundy foliage that is attractive all summer. A compact growth habit makes the tree an excellent choice for a specimen in the landscape or even in a large container.

- Burgundy foliage changes to orange-yellow in the fall, providing 3 seasons of interest.
- Lovely spring blooms.
- Edible fruit, great for baking.
- Adds curb appeal to front yard.

Northern Belle Hardy Fuchsia Crape Myrtle Zones 5-9
Lagerstroemia indica 'GARzarnebefu' PP31835 3-5' tall x 2-3' wide



(Medium growth rate)

Bred for its cold hardiness, this southern ornamental can be enjoyed in the North.

- Hardy and reliable bloomer through zone 5; apply heavy winter mulch for protection.
- Compact form fits nicely into small spaces, as a border accent or specimen planting.
- Vibrant violet-pink blooms in summer, often reblooms later.
- Shows some drought tolerance with age.

European Variegated Dogwood Zones 2-8
Cornus alba 'Elegantissima' 6-8' tall x 4-10' wide

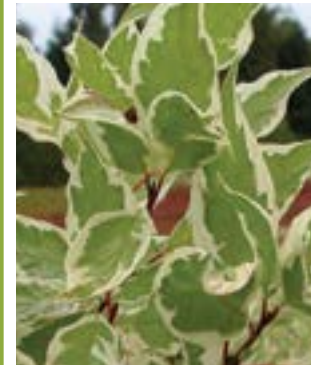


(Fast growth rate)

Add a welcome splash of red in winter with this colorful shrub.

- RHS Award of Merit winner.
- Variegated foliage in the growing season.
- Fast-growing with an upright, spreading habit.
- Versatile—great as a hedge, erosion control or as a specimen planting.
- Deer and rabbit resistant.

Ivory Halo Dogwood Zones 3-7
Cornus alba 'Ivory Halo' 4-6' tall x 4-6' wide



(Fast growth rate)

Deciduous shrub provides striking color and eye-catching appeal all year round.

- Clusters of white flowers cover the shrub in spring, sometimes reblooming into summer.
- White berries, some with a hint of blue, appear in summer; a favorite of birds.
- Variegated green and white foliage; turns to shades of burgundy in fall.
- Red stems add color to winter landscapes.

Kousa White Dogwood Zones 5-8
Cornus kousa 15-30' tall x 15-30' wide

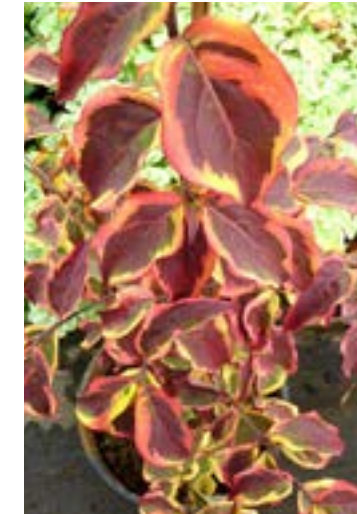


(Slow to medium growth rate)

Ornamental tree that provides a great display of flowers in late spring; exhibits more cold hardiness and disease resistance than our native flowering dogwood.

- Showy white flowers measure 3-5" across and yield berries that are attractive to songbirds.
- Beautiful red fall foliage and attractive mottled bark is most visible in winter.
- Deer resistant.

Summer Gold Dogwood Zones 5-9
Cornus kousa 'Summer Gold' 15' tall x 15' wide



(Slow to medium growth rate)

Green and yellow variegated foliage draws attention to the landscape.

- Yellow leaf margins turn pink in fall, entire leaf ages to bright red later in the season.
- Masses of creamy white, bloomlike bracts in mid to late spring.
- Small, upright tree shape broadens at maturity.
- Resistant to common diseases.

Black Tower Elderberry Zones 5-8
Sambucus nigra 'Eiffel I' PP23633 6-8' tall x 3-4' wide



(Fast growth rate)

Unique columnar shape creates a stunning focal point or entryway accent.

- Striking burgundy foliage draws all eyes to the landscape; great curb appeal.
- Clusters of bright pink flowers add a pop of color to the dark background foliage.
- Red-black berries provide late-season food for birds and wildlife.
- Harvest berries for delicious wine or jam.

Emerald Gaiety Euonymus Zones 4-8
Euonymus fortunei 'Emerald Gaiety' 4-5' tall x 24-36" wide

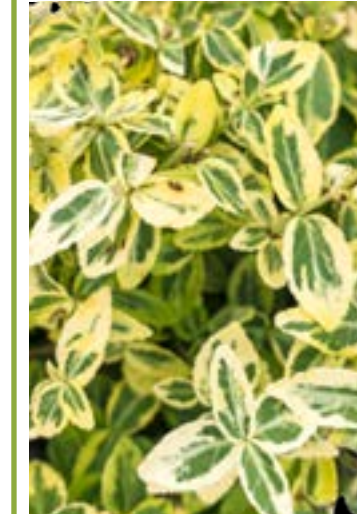


(Slow growth rate)

Variegated foliage adds contrast, interest and texture to gardens and landscapes.

- Year-round interest.
- Use as a ground cover, foundation planting or to accent borders and beds.
- Dark green foliage with white margins in spring and summer; fall and winter foliage has pink-tinted edges.
- Can be trained to climb a support.

Emerald 'n Gold Euonymus Zones 5-8
Euonymus fortunei 'Emerald 'n Gold' 20-24" tall x 24-36" wide

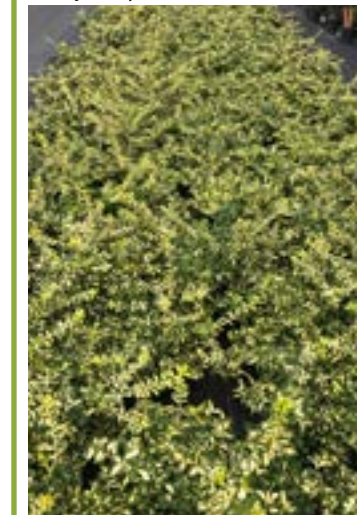


(Fast growth rate)

Makes a fantastic ground cover with colorful variegated foliage.

- Year-round interest.
- Also used as a foundation planting or to add year-round color to borders and beds.
- Dark green foliage with gold margins in spring and summer; fall and winter foliage turns pinkish red.
- Can be trained to climb a support.

Moonshadow Euonymus Zones 5-8
Euonymus fortunei 'Moonshadow' 12-24" tall x 24-36" wide

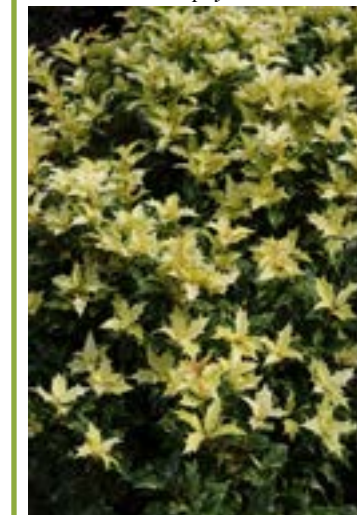


(Fast growth rate) once established

Spruce up a garden or landscape with rich foliage that also provides year-round color.

- Green and yellow variegated foliage in spring and summer; shows a hint of pink in fall and winter.
- Great for slopes, beneath trees or cascading over walls.
- For best results, plant in moist, well-drained soil; add mulch in winter.

Goshiki False Holly Zones 6-10
Osmanthus heterophyllus 'Goshiki' 5-7' tall x 6-8' wide



(Slow growth rate)

Colorful variegated foliage and fragrant blooms make this a go-to landscape tree.

- RHS Award of Garden Merit winner.
- Attracts pollinators of all kinds.
- Ideal for borders, wooded sites and as a privacy screen.
- Shows excellent drought tolerance, once established.
- Deer resistant.



Lynwood Gold Forsythia

Forsythia intermedia 'Lynwood Gold'

Zones 4-9
8-10' tall x 10' wide

(Medium growth rate)

Vivid yellow flowers blanket this shrub in early spring. Makes a great hedge or screen.

- Fall foliage is eye-catching purple.
- Cut late-winter branches and they'll bloom indoors.
- Flowers are evenly distributed along each stem.
- Ideal for a specimen planting, as a privacy screen or plant in groups for a hedgerow.

Blue Prince Holly

Ilex x meserveae 'Blue Prince'



(Medium growth rate)

An evergreen shrub with an upright habit and classic foliage form.

- Bears glossy, blue-green, serrated foliage with dark purplish stems.
- Grows up to 12 feet tall—great for defining spaces or as an ornamental hedgerow.
- Does not produce fruit, only pollen.
- Makes an excellent pollinator for female holly cultivars.

Zones 4-7

8-12' tall x 8-10' wide

Royal Duet Holly

Ilex x meserveae



(Medium growth rate)

This is a combination container that is made by planting the female red-berry-producing 'Blue Princess' variety with the male pollinating plant 'Blue Prince'.

- A female Holly requires a male plant in the area for pollination and producing the decorative red berries.
- This innovative way of pairing both varieties into one container saves space in the landscape.

Blue Princess Holly

Ilex x meserveae 'Blue Princess' PP03675



(Medium growth rate)

Traditional evergreen shrub with bright red berries. Used as accent plants or hedges.

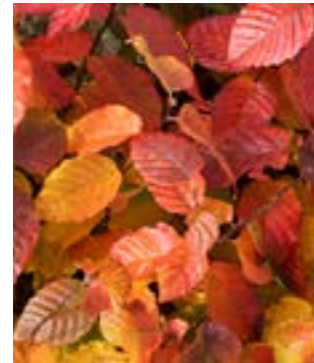
- Glossy, blue-green, serrated foliage with dark purplish stems.
- Grows taller than male counterpart—up to 15 feet—makes an excellent privacy screen.
- Requires a male pollinator for fruit production.
- Shows excellent cold hardiness.

10-15' tall x 8-10' wide

Wisconsin Red American Hornbeam

Carpinus caroliniana 'MY Select Strain'



(Slow growth rate)

A fine screening or privacy tree with colorful fall foliage and attractive winter bark.

- Fall foliage in shades of red, yellow and orange; best color display in full sun.
- Smooth, gray bark creates winter interest.
- Shows excellent disease resistance.
- Attracts pollinators of all sorts and backyard birds.
- Dependable, easy-to-grow landscape tree.

Zones 3-9

15-20' tall x 10-15' wide

Pyramidal European Hornbeam

Carpinus betulus 'Fastigiata'



(Medium growth rate)

Full, lush, deciduous tree fills landscape space all the way to the ground.

- Displays a narrow form when young, but ages to a wide oval-vase shape.
- Requires little pruning to maintain shape; can be hard pruned if grown as a hedge.
- Shows yellow to green catkins in early spring.
- Tolerates urban air pollution.

30-40' tall x 20-30' wide

Blue Jangles Hydrangea

Hydrangea macrophylla 'SMHMTAU' PP27035



(Medium growth rate)

Compact shrub with great curb appeal. Big, mophead-type blooms all summer long.

- Big-leaf hydrangea is ornamental even when not in bloom.
- Blooms on both new and old wood for a longer, more reliable blooming period.
- Flowers are blue in acid soil, pink in alkaline soil.
- Proven to perform reliably even in zone 5.

12-24" tall x 24-36" wide

All Summer Beauty Hydrangea

Hydrangea macrophylla 'All Summer Beauty'



(Fast growth rate)

This mophead variety blooms on both old and new wood all summer long.

- Fully double blooms appear violet-blue in alkaline soil, pink in acid soils.
- Winter hardy to zone 5.
- Bright green, large-leaf foliage provides a nice backdrop to the colorful blooms.
- Easy-care plants require little maintenance and minimal pruning to retain shape.

Endless Summer BloomStruck® Hydrangea

Hydrangea macrophylla 'PIIHM-II' PP255666



(Medium growth rate)

Showy flowering shrub blooms on both old and new wood. Flowers are large.

- Mophead-type blooms are blue-purple in acid soil, rose-pink in alkaline soil.
- Tolerates heat well; requires only minimal pruning to maintain shape.
- Ruby-red stems add to its colorful display.
- Disease-resistant, especially to powdery mildew.

Annabelle Hydrangea

Hydrangea arborescens 'Annabelle'



(Medium growth rate)

Reliable shrub blooms without fail, creating a bold statement in the garden or landscape.

- Large clusters of small, white blooms in midsummer, fading to soft green with age.
- Tolerates many soil types and pH levels.
- Blooms may last through fall and into winter.
- Toffee-bronze foliage compliments white blooms, great for containers, window boxes.

3-6' tall x 3-4' wide

Forever and Ever® Together Hydrangea

Hydrangea macrophylla 'REI05'



(Medium growth rate)

Showy dwarf variety produces large blooms on both old and new wood.

- Reliable, double blooms with a color-changing habit.
- Compact, neat shrub, great for borders or as accent plants.
- Blooms start out light green in spring, maturing to violet or pink by late summer.
- Attracts butterflies to the landscape.

Zones 5-9

24-36" tall x 3-5' wide
